

419 Ale Trail taps into local breweries Beer crafters collaborate across region to offer new experiences

Ohio's craft beer adventure is back with a brand new format and the same great taste.

Having just completed its fourth round, the 419 Ale Trail is swapping out its traditional prize-based, year-long round format for a new, customizable, and self-guided experience. Whether you're a beer connoisseur, a weekend explorer, or a local looking to try something new, the 419 Ale Trail has a little something for everyone to sip on.

"The 419 Ale Trail has always been a

highlight the booming local brewery scene in the 419 area. When it first launched, the trail featured around 30 participating breweries. Since then, it has become a staple in the community, with more participants and more local businesses than ever before.

"It's a great way to get the, 'live like a local experience,' by exploring the Toledo region and Northwest Ohio as a whole, through the eyes of a local," Heuring said.

#### New year, new format

Starting this fall, the Ale Trail will be a completely self-guided experience.

The new format includes:

- Redesigned printed and digital 419 Ale Trail map
- Expanded list of breweries
- A check-off style printed guide for visitors
- Free annual promotional sticker

Instead of checking in to breweries on your phone and winning tiered prizes, there will be a redesigned printed and digital map for more flexible exploration.

"If there are marketplace changes or different breweries that come off-line, or come online, we will update those resources annually, but it won't operate on an annual round process anymore," Heuring said. "It'll be very much a doit-yourself, explore at your own leisure type of experience."

The new format is designed without the pressure of a time limit, allowing participants to stroll through the 419 and stop by breweries as they please.

While the format is changing, Heuring assured that collectible stickers will still be available.

"We will still do a fun, free annual promotional sticker," Heuring said. "We've always changed it up a little bit each year so people can collect it and put it on their coolers and put it on their growlers, but that will be the only prize. We're really trying to refocus the experience on the breweries themselves because they have so much to offer, each one is unique and this is kind of a simpler, flexible way to approach it."

#### Local businesses, hidden gems

Featuring more than just craft brews, each location on the trail map offers a wide range of food, music, atmosphere and more.

"A lot of these breweries are coming up with really unique brews on their own

for all sorts of different themes, reasons, and tastes. We really try to highlight that."

In Findlay, Crafted Nano Brewery, False Chord Brewing and Findlay Brewing Company have been spots on the trail. Nearby, breweries in Fostoria, Tiffin and Carey have also been stops along the way, and more breweries are added with some frequency.

Participants have also discovered hidden gems outside of their traditional go-to spots.

"It moves people around the area because it has such a large footprint," Heuring said. "There are folks who start the trail or explore the trail coming from all different angles, maybe they're from a different county and they've not tried some different breweries in Toledo or maybe they're from Toledo and they've not checked out some of the breweries more towards the Sandusky area. There is a wide variety within the footprint, so it's not only brought people to our corner of the state from Columbus, Cleveland, to other neighboring areas, but it's also helped people explore our own backyard."

For many years, participants have hit every stop on the map.

"We've always had people complete the map every year and win all the different prizes that you can," Heuring said. "It's definitely something that takes a while because it's no small feat, but it's definitely something that people have worked towards."

Whether you're a local looking to explore what's in your own backyard, a tourist searching for the greatest spots in the area, or a traveler passing through on the pursuit for a cold one, the Ale Trail is a chance to make some great memories in the 419.



# 100 Years Ago This Month: Historical events from September 1925

The month of September has been home to many historical events over the years. Here's a look at some that helped to shape the world in September 1925.

- · Global commerce continues to be disrupted when Danish seamen go on strike over their wages on September 1. The Danish seamen's decision to go on strike follows similar moves by seamen in China and throughout the British Empire.
- · Hermann Göring is hospitalized in the psychiatric ward of a Swedish hospital after assaulting a nurse on September 1. Göring, who was in Sweden to overcome a morphine addiction, would later serve as chief advisor to Adolf Hitler and commander of the Luftwaffe during World War II.
- · The Second International Conference on the Standardization of Medicine is held in Geneva, Switzerland, on September 3. The conference aims to standardize drug formulas across the globe.
- · Comintern leader Grigory Zinoviev, Deputy Premier Finance Commissar Grigory Sokolnikov and Lev Kamenev are among those to sign a joint protest against Soviet Communist Party Secretary Joseph Stalin on September 5. All three men would eventually be executed during Stalin's Great Purge.
- $\cdot$  Striking sailors are barricaded aboard the SS Sophocles before it pulls out of

Cape Town, South Africa en route to Australia on September 5. The ship is ultimately forced to return to Cape Town when the sailors refuse to work.

- · British police fire on a crowd of 2,000 demonstrators in Shanghai on September 7. The crowd was protesting unequal treaties.
- · A deal between the Italian government and explorer Roald Amundsen is announced on September 8. The deal entails Amundsen using the dirigible N-1 in an attempt to fly to the North Pole in 1926.
- · A white mob estimated at 5,000 people gathers in Detroit in an effort to intimidate Dr. Ossian Sweet on September 9. Dr. Sweet, who was Black, had purchased a home in an all-white neighborhood, and the mob aimed to force him to vacate the property.
- · Xavier University of Louisiana opens on September 13. It is the world's first Catholic University for African Americans.
- · Riley B. King is born near Berclair, Mississippi on September 16. The boy grows up to become a legendary blues musician known the world over as B.B. King.
- · Eighteen-year-old Frida Kahlo is nearly killed in an auto accident in Mexico City on September 17. Though Kahlo

sustains multiple injuries in the accident, including a fractured spinal column, it's during her bedridden two-year recovery period that she first begins to paint.

- · The third-longest rail tunnel in the United States opens on September 19. The tunnel is two miles long and passes through Mount Judah in the Sierra Nevada Mountains.
- The United States submarine USS S-51 sinks off the coast of Rhode Island on September 25. The submarine had collided with a merchant steamer, and 33 of the 36 crew members aboard perished in the collision.
- · Greek Prime Minister Theodoros Pangalos creates the country's first spy agency on September 25. The agency, Ypiresía Ethnikís Asfaleías (YES), is conceived to fight the Communist Party of Greece.
- · The Yellow River overflows in Shandong Province in China on September 27. Hundreds of people die in the region's worst flooding since 1887.
- · Jewelry valued at three quarters of a million dollars is stolen from Woolworth heiress Jessie Woolworth Donahue while she is a guest at the Plaza Hotel on September 30. The jewelry was stolen while Mrs. Donahue was in a bathtub a few feet away.
