### Go green on St. Patrick's Day

Traditional Irish food and drink on tap in NW Ohio, as is a race

St. Patrick's Day is the country's annual celebration of all things Irish culture, and it always means plenty of traditional Irish fare and flair at staple pubs and publicans in the 419.

You can find a green beer at any number of bars around, but some establishments are green year-round, with publicans providing patrons live music, ambience, Guinness on tap and boxties on the corkboard.

So, if you want to experience the closest thing to a real Irish pub experience this St. Paddy's Day in the 419, check out one of these establishments.

#### Logan's Irish Pub — Findlay

Opening on Flag City's Main Street strip in 2010, Logan's Irish Pub was founded by Karen Logan to provide authentic Irish cuisine to the



region. Shepherd's pie, stew and fish 'n' chips are always on the menu, and the kitchen features a revolving specials menu that changes

frequently. Just about any weekend you'll find performers on the mic and a full house, and this year St. Patrick's Day the pub is putting on a special event, called the "Pub Club."

The pub is raffling off five Pub Club memberships on the holiday; the lucky winners will get \$10 dining credit every week for a year, and it's free to enter.

#### Toledo-area pubs

The greater Toledo area is home to a number of Irish-themed pubs and restaurants — here are just a few to get you started.

The Blarney Irish Pub on Monroe Street near Fifth Third Field boasts a full menu of Irish cuisine and a fleet of import beers to give an authentic feel to any St. Patrick's Day hangout. You can get a corned beef-filled boxty, Smithwick's-battered haddock with chips and you can chase it down with a fresh pint. For pub fans, it may not get much better than that.

The route starts at Ye Olde Cock 'n Bull downtown, then heads over to Homeslice Pizza, Whiskey Red Saloon and the aforementioned Blarney Irish Pub among others. The crawl takes place from 4-10 p.m. and includes a party cup, lanyard, green and gold party

Registration and T-shirt pick-up orders start at 8:30 a.m. on Saturday, March 14, with the race starting at 10 a.m.

And if you find yourself in the Toledo area gearing up for a few pints at the pub, the Glass City hosts a similar event, the Shamrock Shuffle, at 8 a.m. Saturday, March 14. The race begins in the heart of the city and winds through downtown.



# CRAFTS ARE A LUCKY BET FOR ST. PATRICK'S DAY CELEBRATIONS

While it certainly can be fun to visit a pub and raise a pint in honor of St. Patrick's Day on March 17, such efforts are not necessarily a family-friendly way to commemorate the patron saint of the Emerald Isle. Thankfully, there are plenty of activities for children and adults that focus less on imbibing and more on hands-on fun so everyone can be involved equally. Crafting often fits that bill.

The following are some unique craft ideas to celebrate the spirit of St. Patrick's Day. Many of these projects include items you may already have around the house.

## Shamrock key chain

Find your favorite salt dough recipe and use a shamrock cookie cutter to cut out the shape of a lucky clover. Poke a hole at the top where you can connect a key ring. When the shamrock is dried and hardened, paint it in a vivid shade of green. Attach keys, a school ID or anything else to the key ring, or simply hang it from a backpack.

## Leprechaun hats

With a little green paint, green card stock and construction paper in black and gold, anyone can create miniature leprechaun hats. Paint the toilet paper tube green, then wrap the bottom in a strip of black and place a gold "buckle" made out of a rectangle of gold or yellow paper. Glue the tube to a round of green card stock, and voila, you have a perfect leprechaun hat for decorating a room or table.

## Easy rainbow craft

Grab some fruity O-shaped cereal and let kids sort the colors into red, orange, yellow, green, and purple. Glue rows of these colored cereal rings onto a piece of white cardstock to make the rainbow. At the base of the rainbow, glue some cotton balls to serve as the clouds.

## Beaded bracelets

Visit a craft store and stock up on small green, white and gold beads, as well as some bracelet wire or poly string. Spend a few hours making bracelets that everyone can wear



with their green attire for St. Patrick's Day. The bracelets also can be given as gifts.

## Shamrock slime

Those who can find green glitter glue and shamrock confetti can turn their favorite slime recipe into one worthy of St. Patrick's Day.

## Rainbow cereal bars

Incorporate some of the marshmallows from a favorite "lucky" cereal brand into the mix of rice cereal treats to

give them a rainbow-inspired upgrade.

## Pots of gold

If you have leftover plastic witches' cauldrons from Halloween, paint them gold and use them to store foil-wrapped chocolate coins. Otherwise, tie green helium-filled balloons to the cauldron to make a perfect centerpiece.


