### 'Scout' out Black Swamp's summer camps

FINDLAY--- The Black Swamp Area Council of Scouting America is putting on summer camps at Camp Berry for all children, not just Scouts.

Marc Kogan, BSAC Scout executive, recently highlighted three camps to check out: Adventure Camp, Family Camp and Cub Resident Camp. All are happening at Camp Berry, located at 11716 County Road 40 in Findlay.

"Summer camp is a great opportunity for young people to get outside and enjoy the outdoors and have those experiences and build resilience, make new friends and learn new experiences, and it gets them out from in front of screens and out into the great outdoors," Kogan said.

#### Adventure Camp

Adventure Camp is a day camp lasting seven weeks for boys and girls going into 1st-5th grade.

"It runs [seven] weeks starting June 16, all the way through the week of Aug. 3-7. The week of the Fourth of July, we don't have camp," Kogan said.

This year, the seven weeks are all themed around dinosaurs. Campers will practice teamwork, theater, outdoor skills, engineering, science and more based around the Mesozoic Era. Lunch is also included daily.

"The kids will get to (swim) in our pool, try archery, fishing, Gaga ball, volleyball, music, climbing and crafts," Kogan said.

All campers entering 1st grade must be accompanied by a parent or guardian for the entire day; campers older than that may be dropped off and picked up.

Camp runs Monday through Friday from 8 a.m. to 4:15 p.m. For an extra charge, campers can be dropped off

between 7 and 8 a.m. and picked up between 4:15 and 6 p.m.

For current Scouts, the weekly fee is \$215, and for children who are not currently Scouts, the first week is \$255, and after that, each week is \$215.

To go to Adventure Camp, you don't have to sign up for every week, but there is a discount if you do. There are more discounts that may apply for

“From a scouting perspective, what I like to say is ‘three-fourths of the word Scouting is outing,’ and that’s where we make the magic happen ... not only just for the scout, but any young person that attends any of our camps. All of our camps are open to all youth,” Kogan said.

### Family Camp

Family Camp is a weekend-long camp where the whole family can explore Camp Berry.

“You get to experience all of those same program areas that we had for our Adventure Camp, but as a family, so as long as you have an elementary school-aged child, you can come out and have that experience,” Kogan said.

The camp runs from noon on Saturday, June 20, to 10 a.m. on Sunday, June 21.

“You will get to do archery, the BB range, climbing, swimming and then we’ll feed everybody in the dining hall for dinner,” Kogan said. “Then we’ll do a campfire, and you can stay in a tent you bring or a tent the camp provides. In the morning, you have breakfast and head on out.”

Family Camp is open to scout and non-scout adults with children, both girls

### Cub Resident Camp

Cub Resident Camp is a four-day, three-night camp for campers to explore everything nature has to offer.

“It’s a three-night, four-day experience for elementary school children, boys and girls, rising from second grade to rising into fifth grade,” Kogan said. “The youth going into second and third grade have to be accompanied by their parents.”

The camp is open to Scouts and non-Scouts.

Campers will get to swim, try archery, make crafts and learn outdoor skills.

There are two different sessions you can sign up for, one is from July 5 at noon to July 8 at 10 a.m., and the other is from July 8 at noon to July 11 at 10 a.m.

The cost is \$100 for adults and \$290 per child.



# Heartworm is a serious medical issue for pets

Pet ownership requires taking steps to ensure the health and happiness of the companion animal. Ensuring that steps are taken to help a pet avoid illness is a priority that pet parents must take seriously. This includes being aware of diseases that have the potential to affect their animals.

## A biting health problem

The American Veterinary Medical Association says heartworm disease remains one of the most significant and growing medical threats to pets. While the illness once was localized to parts of the southern United States, heartworm disease now poses a threat to animals in many other regions as well. That's due in part to the widespread territory of the insect responsible for spreading the heartworm parasite: the mosquito.

Although the southeastern U.S. and the Mississippi River Valley remain the areas with the highest concentrations of heartworm disease, the Companion Animal Parasite Council says veterinarians are now diagnosing heartworm at higher rates in northern states like Colorado, Montana and North Dakota. According to Albert Animal Health Source, heartworm disease exists across Canada, too, particularly in warmer regions with high mosquito activity.

## What is heartworm disease?

Heartworm disease is a serious, potentially fatal blood-borne illness spread by mosquitoes that largely affects dogs. Cats, ferrets, wolves, foxes, and other mammals also can get the disease. Heartworms can

live in the heart, lungs and associated blood vessels. Heartworm disease can cause lasting organ damage.

The American Heartworm Society says heartworms are foot-long worms that start off as microscopic larvae called microfilaria that circulate in the bloodstream. When a mosquito takes a blood meal, it can spread these worms to other animals. It takes about six months for the larvae to develop into adult heartworms. Once mature, heartworms can live five to seven years in dogs and two to three years in cats.

## Keeping pets safe

The cost comparison between keeping a pet safe from heartworms and treating an active infection is significant. Most monthly preventives cost between \$6 and \$18 per month, according to PetMD. For a dog that tests positive, a full heartworm treatment protocol can typically cost around \$1,500. Despite this, only about one-third of all dogs in the U.S. are on a consistent preventive, says the AHS.

Veterinary professionals recommend annual testing through bloodwork for both adult worms and the larvae to ensure that no gap infections have occurred. Furthermore, heartworm preventives should be used each and every month, as mosquito activity is no longer seasonal in many areas.

Keeping pets safe requires taking steps to prevent heartworm infections. This is achieved through annual testing and monthly preventives.



# Documents to gather as you begin tax preparation

## Tax Day



Spring is synonymous with many things. While blooming flowers and the sense of rejuvenation they bring may be the first things that come to mind, this beloved time of year also marks the beginning of tax season. As Americans prepare their income tax returns, the Internal Revenue Service (IRS) offers guidance on the documents taxpayers should gather to file successfully.

### Personal information

- Social Security number (SSN) or individual tax ID number (ITIN): The IRS issues an ITIN, which is always a nine-digit number, to taxpayers who are not eligible for an SSN.
- Bank account and routing numbers for direct deposits (refunds) or debits (for tax payments)
- Your adjusted gross income and exact refund amount from last year's return
- Your name as it appears on record with the Social Security

### Administration.

- Your current address
- Your self-select PIN (for taxpayers who e-filed last year)
- Identity Protection (IP) PIN, if issued by the IRS. This six-digit number helps prevent someone else from filing a tax return using your SSN or ITIN.

### Forms

- W-2 or a corrected W-2 showing wages from employers
- Form W-2G for lottery and gambling winnings
- Forms 1099: There are numerous forms 1099 that show various types of income, and taxpayers will need to include any that reflect income they have earned that is not indicated on a W-2 or W-2G

### Documents for credits or deductions

- Childcare or dependent care expenses
- Home mortgage and property tax records

- Donations to charity
- Health savings account or flexible spending account contributions
- Health care expenses (the IRS notes special rules apply for anyone hoping to itemize health care expenses as deductions)
- Retirement contributions
- Receipts for books, tuition and other education expenses (for teachers and students)

### Documents from side jobs and self-employment

- Statements from banks, payment apps, card processors, or online marketplaces
- Checks paid to you
- Receipts and mileage logs for travel, gift and car expenses
- Records of deductible office expenses
- Estimated tax payments
- Other business income and expense records


